## Conscience and technology are condemned to each other!

t is remarkable to realize that special forces also bring a special responsibility. Where our conscience gnaws when we see in developing countries how crops fail as a result of both climate change, and people who have only partially incorporated 'our' Western technology into their daily practice, with the result that strife, poverty and misery have become the ingredients for their flight towards our rational "first" world. But there is little we can do. We are governed by our own "successes" in an economy where our immediate existence seems to be completely separate from the model of infinite growth from finite sources that lies beneath it, in which high-tech giants calm our global consciences extraordinarily comfortably with bread and circuses: games, social media, filter bubbles, and other new must-haves.

But that conscience may well be our life jacket, for It is older than any modern technology and given by Mother Nature herself. With our conscience, Mother Nature is stronger than human economics and technology, and I am convinced that conscience will ultimately help turn the tide. Technology can help gain insight. Get ready for a smart world means to me: listen (again) to your conscience, focus on your immediate living environment and realize that even heating your home is a superpower, which you also have to justify. For this we have at our disposal all these beautiful stories: magic, mysticism, science and wisdom, and both in our daily life, and in our dreams and art we can learn to connect them in such a way that even after our generations there will still be human existence.
